








Forest ownership & management in Switzerland



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Forest ownership & management in Switzerland

- Ownership stable: 70% public, 27% private, 3% mixed
- Challenge: number an actors
- Management: push for increased cooperation



Research question and methods

- How do stakeholders (not just owners) perceive Swiss forest policy?
- Expert interviews (11) and online survey with national stakeholders (83; 54% response rate):
 - Institutions of the policy system
 - Forest management (includes owners)
 - Timber industry
 - Environmental association
 - Other type of association
 - Science & education




Swiss forest policy

- Swiss Federal Forest Act and Ordinance
- Forest Policy 2020 federal policy setting strategic guidelines -> leading to recent revisions in Federal Forest Act and Ordinance
- Aim: sustainable forest management and to create favorable conditions for efficient and innovative forestry and wood industry
- Sets 11 objectives, 5 prioritized
- Basis for cantonal forest policies, forest owners and managers



Perceptions of the Swiss Forest Policy 2020 Stakeholder rankings of importance of objectives



Objective 6 – "improving the economic performance of the forestry and wood industry" most frequently chosen

Criticisms: lacking participation, financial tools and economic aspects regarded as needing improvement



Conclusion

- Overall positive perception of Swiss Forest Policy 2020
- But:
 - Misfit between preferences of stakeholders and the Confederation regarding prioritized objectives
 - Criticisms of lacking participation
 - Concerns regarding financial tools and economic aspects
- Reconsider economic aspects in terms of prioritized objectives, tools and responsibilities
- Participatory approach in the future?
- Financial tools as means to foster cooperation?
